



Camper Code of Conduct 2021

Stay-At-Home Order

April 30, 2021

This code is in effect from the 7th day of May 2021 until the Stay-at-Home Order is lifted.

Dear Campers,

Shady Pines Campgrounds welcomes you back! Please read this Code of Conduct (the Code) and review it with all family members. We are under a Provincial mandated Stay at Home Order. We are following the regulations and directives as mandated by the Province of Ontario, the Middlesex-London Health Unit, and local Municipal Bylaw Officers.

The rules in this Code must be followed to ensure we all stay safe and do not engage in activities that contravene any Government regulations and that we comply with all health guidelines. It is important to remember that, ultimately, we are all in charge of our own health and safety. This Code is over and above our normal campground rules, which still apply.

If you have a fever or flu-type symptoms, please stay home. If you have tested positive for COVID-19, are a presumptive case, or have been in contact with anyone who has tested positive or is a presumptive case, you may not enter the campground. By entering the premises, you acknowledge that you are fully aware of the risks and hazards with respect to infectious diseases inherent in your attendance at the campground. You agree to follow all precautions recommended related to infectious diseases including social distancing, gathering regulations, wearing of masks, and frequent hand sanitizing and washing.

O. Reg. 265/21: Stay at Home Order

Seasonal campers who have a full season contract are permitted to enter the campground and remain at their trailers during the Stay-at-Home Order with the following restrictions:

- If you have no other residence in Ontario
- If you come to the campground and stay for less than 24 hours for purposes as set out in the [Order](#) (section 19-22)
- If you do visit your trailer for longer than 24 hours, you must remain on the campground for 14 consecutive days before leaving for non-essential reasons. If you need to leave for any non-essential reason, you cannot return to the campground for 14 days.
- You are permitted to leave the campground for essential purposes such as grocery, medical appointments, pharmacy, caregiving, school, and work that can not be done remotely.
- Gatherings: You are not allowed to gather indoors or outdoors with anyone you do not live with, except one other person from outside of the household that lives alone. If you live alone, you can have close contact with only one other household. Caregivers are permitted to provide care for another person in need, such as an ill spouse or partner, a child, or an aging relative.
- Physical distance of not less than 2m from everyone else.

This will remain in effect until the Provincial Stay at Home Order is lifted. Once the order is lifted, we will return to the colour coded system and an updated Code of Conduct will be issued.

Seasonal trailers are required to have electricity, water and washroom facilities. All recreational facilities in the campground and all other shared facilities in the campground must be closed. Exception: laundry facilities (1 person at a time), lodge washrooms, and the pavilion may open for wifi for online schooling or work purposes only. Social distancing must be observed.

Shady Pines is committed to the health and safety of our campers and staff by implementing Covid screening, increased signage, cleaning & sanitizing between customers, providing hand sanitizer, portable wash station, and PPE for our staff. We recommend that if you are eligible for the Covid vaccine that you do so to protect yourself and others. An outbreak of COVID-19 or one of the variants could close the campground.

Office/Store

- Enter by the front door of the lounge, exit only at the side door of the store.
- Masks are required, use hand sanitizer provided, and practice social distancing.
- 1 person is permitted inside the office/store at one time.
- If another customer is inside, you may line up outside. Wear a mask while in line and stay 2m from others. Or remain in your car until the line has diminished.
- For your convenience fees can be paid by e-transfer to: eftpayment@shadypinescampgrounds.com. Include your name and site number in the message area.

Entrance

To be permitted entry to the campground, your seasonal fees must be paid (or payment plan approved), Contracts, General Liability Waivers Including Covid for each person, and proof of insurance have been provided. Gate card access will be turned on at that time.

Gathering Rules

Social gatherings indoors or outdoors are permitted ONLY with:

- members who reside in your household at your permanent residence
- one other person who lives alone and has joined with your household

Common Areas

CLOSED: Lounge Rec Hall, Chalet, Playground, Bounce pad, gaga pit, basketball, sand volleyball, shuffleboard, horseshoes, bocci, darts, golf course, block washrooms. If you aren't sure, ask at the office.

OPEN: (social distancing, no gatherings with those who do not reside at your permanent residence)

- Office / Store – essential items only
- Pavilion for wifi access for online school or remote work purposes only (closes 8 pm)
- Dog park
- Pond area for fishing
- Laundry (1 person at a time)
- Lodge washrooms (1 person at a time)
- Trails

Additional People or Family Listed on Contracts / Visitors

Additional adults or family listed on your contract who do not reside at your permanent residence, will not be permitted to come to your trailer during the stay-at-home order. Exception: if you or they live alone and have joined with each other's household. Visitors are not permitted.

Children/Youth

Parents are responsible to ensure their children know and obey the restrictions under the Stay-at-Home Order. If your children cannot follow these rules, please do not bring them to the campground at this time.

Golf Carts

Golf carts riders are restricted to only those who reside at your permanent residence, or one other person who lives alone and has joined with your household.

Walking around the Campground You may leave your trailer for exercise around the park or to take your dog to the dog park, stay 2m apart from anyone you meet. If you want to say hello to your neighbours and friends, please do so ... from a distance. With your cooperation, we'll get through this sooner.
